### Displaying and Assembling the Classifying Nouns Poster and Mats Set

Before separating and displaying the **Classifying Nouns Poster and Mats Set**, make copies of this Really Good Stuff® Activity Guide and file the pages for future use. Or, download another copy of it from our Web site at www.reallygoodstuff.com. Separate the *Classifying Nouns Poster and Mats.* Store the *Mats* where they are accessible. Hang the *Poster* where students will be able to see it easily.

#### Introducing the Classifying Nouns Poster and Mats Set

Explain that there are four types of nouns: People, places, things, and ideas. Point to the *Poster* and review with students the different types of people nouns. Ask students what other people nouns they can think of and record their answers on a sheet of chart paper. You may want to point out that some of the people nouns have capital letters and some do not, which would be a good introduction to proper nouns should students be ready for that objective.

Review with students the examples of places on the *Poster*. Have students share other examples of places and record their answers on the chart paper. Continue this process with the things and ideas sections of the *Poster*.

#### Small Group Sort

Make four sets of the *Classifying Nouns Examples Reproducible:* Copy the reproducible, cut apart the examples and store each set in a plastic bag. Copy the *Classifying Nouns Mat Reproducible,* gather a group of four to eight students, and give each student or pair of students a *Classifying Nouns Mat.* Review the four types of nouns and ask students for a few examples of each. Distribute a *Classifying Nouns Examples Reproducible* set to each student or pair. Work with students to sort a few on their *Mat.* Then have students sort the rest of the examples on their own. Review with students how they sorted the nouns and discuss any challenging ones with them.

**Answers**: People: child, uncle, teacher, Mr. White, Mrs. Conrad; Places: Australia, classroom, school, United States, grocery store; Things: clock, turtle, taco, corn, chair, and; Ideas: weakness, friendship, curiosity, teamwork, happiness.

#### **Classifying Nouns Center**

Copy, cut apart, and store enough sets of the *Classifying Nouns Pictures Reproducible* for a center. Show students the *Classifying Nouns Mats* and explain that students should sort the pictures into the correct section. Copy the *Classifying Nouns Answer Key Reproducible* and have students check their work against the *Answer Key* when they are finished.

#### Classifying Nouns Match Reproducible


Copy and distribute the *Classifying Nouns Match Reproducible*. Instruct students to identify which of the four nouns the listed noun is. Either review answers with students as a class or collect the assignment as an assessment.

**Answers**: Niagara Falls—place, baseball bat—thing, elephant—thing, love—idea, Hannah Montana—people, beauty—idea, nephew—people, amusement park—place, popcorn—thing, Dr. Feldman—people, sadness—idea, library—place, firefighter—people, strength—idea, desert—place

#### Classifying Nouns Assessment

Copy and distribute the Classifying Nouns Mat Reproducible and either the Classifying Nouns Pictures Reproducible or Classifying Nouns Examples Reproducible. Have students cut apart the examples. Instruct students to sort and paste the examples inside the correct section on their Mat. Collect and review their completed work to identify students who need more practice identifying the four groups of nouns.


